Open to grades 5- 8 for the 2023-2024 school year at OLPH and St. Theresa Middle Schools

- Available to French Immersion students at OLPH, however instruction for the program will only be available in English
- Enrollment in the program at St. Theresa constitutes all of the option programming received for the year
- All classes will be supervised by certified teachers
- Whenever possible professionals in the arts will be employed to conduct workshops

Please note: This program will only run if there is adequate enrolment, accompanied by the commitment deposit.

General registrations open on March 21 2023 and close Apr. 24 2023 Classes will be capped at 30 students. Any subsequent students will be placed on a waiting list.
