SFL participated in wheelchair basketball, also various other phys ed classes were able to participate Performing Arts grade 6 and 8 to OLPH to watch Annie, grade 7 finished playwriting, grade 8 starting to learn Shakespeare

Grade 5 Birch Bay trip, looking for half the cost to be supported by parent council – motion to support Birch Bay, all in favour and no one opposed. It will be in the mid \$2000s

Tana asked about the fundraising information and whether it is being provided out in the classes. Sometimes kids are throwing them out before they get home and sometimes they aren't receiving them in their classrooms.
