Lent – Easter -Pentecost

Each year, at this time we are invited to embark on a journey ... a journey in faith ... the season of Lent - Easter – Pentecost. The word **Lent** means "springtime" or "change." In the early days of the Church, Lent had a baptismal focus. It was that special time of prayer and fasting for those preparing for baptism at Easter (catechumens). For all of us Lent is a time to prepare

for Easter, a time to examine our lives to see if we have lived up to our baptismal commitment, a time to look inside and change our hearts. Lent is a 40-day retreat to help prepare us to celebrate the Easter Triduum, the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord.

We begin the season of Lent with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. As our foreheads are marked with ashes we are commissioned, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel." Though there isn't an explicit mention of Baptism, we are reminded of our baptismal promises to reject sin and profess our faith. This is a clear call to conversion, to the movement away from sin and toward Christ.
